As this is truly a church family who seeks to do our best at offering compassion for one another. Even though we couldn't house Family Promise participants for June, we were at least able to provide baby supplies (diapers, clothes, baby food, etc) for seven families who have infants. Thank you to everyone who has participated, shopped, bagged, volunteered, prayed and donated so that we could continue to be the Church that Christ has called us to be.

As I remember writing down these words from the Trinity Sunday service, let us continue to: Remain Hopeful; have Prayer Partners; be Justice Seekers; be Active Listeners; Denounce Racism; be Peaceful Protestors; while Loving All Equally. And God said, "This is Good!" In spite of everything that's going on around us, God's presence in our lives is good!







