Amen.



JUSTICE AND PEACE UPDATES

J & P Washington DC Trip

The Justice and Peace Team has been busy planning an Intergenerational Trip to Washington D.C. in June. Highlights of this trip will include a tour of the African American Museum of History and Culture, a visit to Capitol Hill for Lobby Day, and a visit to the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial. Eight adults and four youth will attend this social justice trip from June 20 - 22.

National UCC Initiative

National UCC has announced a nationwide UCC study of Ibram X. Kendi's book, **How to Be an Antiracist**. This move is a part of the UCC Join the Movement toward Racial Justice initiative. Ibram Kindi is scheduled to speak about his book at the 2023 General Synod during the Join the Movement toward Racial Justice dinner. Access materials for this initiative are available, and Union's Justice and Peace Team will make plans for how to implement this initiative at Union next Fall.
