MAKING ALL THINGS NEW

Making All Things New was the theme for this year's 2023 General Synod. Rosemarie Lightfoot and I were among those who represented the Florida Conference Delegation. The following Resolutions that we hope to discuss at our August "table talks" during Fellowship Hour include:

Living into God's Economy: Celebrating the 170th Anniversary of the UCC Building & Loan Fund (CB&LF) Celebrates that since 1853 the CB&LF has been helping the church live into God's Economy.

Denouncing the Dobbs Decision and Proclaiming Abortion as Healthcare This resolution denounces the Dobbs decision and affirms abortion as healthcare.

A Resolution Calling for a New Study by our Church on our Relationship with the Indian Boarding Schools and the Boarding Schools in Hawai'i Calls on the UCC to do a new study on the UCC's relationship with Indian boarding schools and boarding schools in Hawai'i.

Closing the Digital Divide: Calling on the UCC to Seek Digital Justice and Inclusion Calls on the UCC to continue working for digital and communications justice.

A Resolution Urging Planning for and Implementing Electrification Calls on UCC to promote electrifying space heating & cooling equipment when they fail or are outdated.

Faithful Advocacy for Intersectional and Transformational Healing in Harm Reduction Harm reduction is understood as a set of practices for minimizing drug related harm.

Affirming Guns to Gardens & Other Gun Violence Prevention Ministries Calls on all settings of the UCC in engaging in meaningful action to address gun violence.

Free from Plastic Pollution Calls on the UCC to join other concerned groups to take action to reduce the plastic pandemic that threatens life and God's creation.

A Resolution Supporting Public School Educators, Academic Freedom, and Equity Efforts in Schools Calls on the UCC to voice support of public-school educators to ensure the advancement of equity.

A Resolution to Study and Develop Reparations Proposals for African Americans Calls the UCC to publicly proclaim its support to study and design Reparations proposals for African Americans.

A Resolution Condemning Prolonged Solitary Confinement as a Form of Torture Calls on the UCC to condemn prolonged solitary confinement as a form of torture.

Actively Affirming the Human Dignity of Transgender and Nonbinary Persons Calls us to a radical welcome to our transgender and non-binary siblings.

A Resolution Calling on UCC Local Churches to Witness "A White Supremacy Free Zone" & Confronting White Supremacy Calls upon predominately white local churches to use a program for implementation.

Looking forward to our August "table talks" and please feel free to reach out to me with your thoughts. It was my honor and pleasure to represent the church during General Synod!



STEWARDSHIP – AUGUST 2023

Greetings Union!

From Bread and Cup to Faith and Giving is our 2022-2023 UCC Stewardship season. It is a constant reminder of the connection between God's generosity and our stewardship. Gratitude and generosity go hand-in-hand with sharing in communion and with our monetary gifts.

Monetary Gifts: It seems that some clarification is needed in regards to 'pledged giving' vs 'designated giving'. I have to admit that this had to be made clear to me a few years ago as well. Pledged giving (or Tithe) is when we fill out the commitment/pledge cards & make a pledge of a specified financial amount for the year. These amounts are placed, or budgeted, in the church's General Fund in order to help pay bills and continue church upkeep throughout the year. Designated giving, such as donations towards Missions, food pantry, & other special offerings, are monetary gifts that are over and above your pledged (tithe) amount. These donations are specific toward the ministries & missions themselves and not to be removed from the General Fund's pledged amounts. So, I hope this explanation helps. If you still have questions about the various types of 'giving', please do not hesitate to ask.

Galatians 6:9 ~ "So let's not allow ourselves to get fatigued doing good. At the right time we will harvest a good crop if we do not give up, or quit." No matter how you give, whether it's your time, your talent or your 10th, you help support our church and its ministries, and we truly 'thank you'. <u>General Synod</u> – Making all things New!

"Do not remember the former things or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert."

I attended General Synod 34 as a first-time delegate from June 29th to July 5th in Indianapolis, Indiana. I finally got a chance to meet other Florida Conference folk in person. I was impressed at how many people were in attendance from various churches across the country - over 2000 in all, of varying ages. Each delegate was given a 'committee assignment' between 1-14 to learn about, give thought to and debate upon. My assignment was #14 which dealt with Confronting White Supremacy in our churches. It was indeed a very powerful topic. Highlights: *Keynote speakers, Rev. Nadia Boltz-Weber, Rev. Amy Brooks (Australia), and Rev. J.J. Flagg. *Meeting missionaries stationed in Africa, Korea & Guatemala (Global Missions workshop). *Shaking hands with Rev. Yvonne Delk, first African American woman ordained as a UCC minister in 1974. *Witnessing the installation of Rev. Karen Georgia Thompson, as General Minister and President of the UCC (a historic moment - the first woman, and the first woman of African descent to lead the UCC). *One very special surprise for me was seeing my former Pastor, Rev. Robb Kojima and his wife Jann, from Maui, HI! Wow! These were definitely awe-inspiring moments that I will cherish.

All in all, the trip to Indianapolis for GS34 was well worth it, and I'm looking forward to Kansas City in 2025!!!
