# A Hope for Peace and Justice for All!

On September 14th, we will celebrate Just Peace Sunday with our wider church and explore the theme, "The Earth Shall Mourn." Also, on Sunday, September 21, we will honor the International Day of Peace, a time to hope and pray that one day, there be peace and justice for all.

On Just Peace Sunday and the International Day of Peace, we will be invited to reflect on the world around us. We will also be invited to recognize where glimpses of peace may be found. In scripture, we see that the "things that make for peace" include loving our enemies, welcoming the outcast, healing diseases and illnesses, feeding the hungry, and the power of love to transform our lives and culture.

Union's Justice and Peace Ministry also invites us not just to 'talk the talk,' but to 'walk the walk.' This hope of forward movement can be found in our mutual repentance and forgiveness. As we seek to better understand God, ourselves, and one another along our journey of faith.

As a Just Peace Church, we can also seek God's strength and guidance on how best to love all of God's creation. Psalm 85 speaks directly about the intersection of justice and peace, stating in verses 11-12.

Kindness and truth shall meet.

Justice and peace shall kiss,

Truth shall spring out of the earth,

And justice shall look down from heaven.

This passage expresses a hope for a time when these virtues, long separated, will be reunited, leading to a flourishing society rooted in both truth and equity.


May our quest to seek the "things that make for peace" begin in each of our hearts. Let it be so. Amen.






"Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion' for God loves a cheerful giver.

In keeping with our 5 for 5 UCC Giving we will be celebrating the Neighbors in Need collection on Oct 05, 2025. You will find envelopes in the back of the chairs in the sanctuary. It is important to understand what this collection is all about, let me start by reminding ourselves why we give to others. As is written on the UCC website, "Giving represents a personal commitment to contribute a portion of one's income or resources to support the work of the church. When we give beyond our tithing we help to sustain and grow ministries outside the walls of our church. It gives us an opportunity to express gratitude and positively impact the world around us."

Neighbors in Need (NIN) annual campaign supports ministries of Justice and Compassion throughout the United States. One-third of the collection goes to the Council of American Indian Ministry and two-third goes to Justice and Witness Ministries to provide grants for justice initiatives, advocacy and direct service projects. In 2025, the NIN Offering will support 26 grant recipients across the UCC who are engaged in projects of direct service and advocacy. Any amount that you can give will be a blessing.

**Scholarships:** This year we awarded two scholarships to Joseph Saintiris and Derya Veziroglu. Congratulations to both of our recipients who have begun their first year of college.

**Food Bank:** After a slow period during the very hot month of August, this amazing team is back to giving out 80+ bags of food. It is important to note that this team would welcome any help or support. Your food or money donation goes directly to help feed the hungry.

**The Prayer Room:** Work on the prayer room was on hold during the summer months, but we look forward to its completion by the end of October. If anyone has Devotional or Prayer books that they would like to donate, it would be very appreciated.

**Free Little Library:** As the weather turns cooler, we will once again be handing out books during the Food Bank distribution.
